

ROAD WORK CONTINUES IN LAKE SHORE

The Lake Shore City Council has approved the 2014 road projects. The 2014 projects include paving 72nd Street which is a town line road (on the north end of the city). This will be an assessed project along with costs being shared with Loon Lake Township. Other road improvement projects include reclaiming and repaving Diana Drive, reconstructing 330 feet of Doyle Parkway and additional storm pond construction, along with reconstructing 800 feet of Jacobs Road including subgrade work. Jacobs Road will require a detour while this work is occurring. These road projects have been awarded to DeChantal Excavating LLC. The road projects should be completed by July 1st.


Last year the City Council approved the use of calcium chloride on the gravel roads within the city. The city received a very positive response on the use of the calcium chloride and is planning on using calcium chloride again this year. Great news! The city was recently awarded a Transportation Alternatives Program grant in the amount of \$327,840! A total of \$3.2 million in federal TAP funds was made available to the Central Minnesota region for 2017 and 2018. Heidi Peper of Short Elliot Hendrickson submitted the grant application on behalf of the city. The city received sponsorship from Cass County and a substantial financial contribution for the project through Cass County Fund 73. This grant is for phase 3 of Trail 77 which encompasses the area from approximately Sherwood Forest to the southern city border. The trail will be incorporated into the County 77 reconstruction plan and is anticipated to be completed in 2017 and 2018.

Minnesota's Year Around Playground on Gull Lake

A dedication ceremony will be held soon at Fritz Loven Park for the fishing pier in honor of Vicki LaMere. Vicki LaMere served on the Lake Shore City Council for 16 of years and was the liaison to the Park and Recreation Committee for many of those years. Vicki was instrumental in making the fishing pier a reality. Her dedication to the city and Fritz Loven Park will not be forgotten.

REMINDER - Phosphorus is Prohibited

Fertilizer and Pesticides. Use of fertilizer and pesticides in the shoreland management district must be done in such a way as to minimize runoff into the Shore Impact Zone or Public water by the use of earth, vegetation or both. The use of fertilizers containing phosphorus is prohibited.

ROAD APPROACH PERMITS REQUIRED

Last fall, the Lake Shore City Council adopted a policy requiring a permit for a road approach or a driveway entrance from a city street. The permit cost is \$25.00 and does require the submittal of a site plan. A city staff member will review the site to determine if a culvert is needed. The cost of the culvert and installation is the responsibility of the property owner. For more information please contact city hall at (218) 963-2148.

News from Living Savior Lutheran Church

POLICE NOTES

Illegal Fireworks Reminder

As a reminder to everyone as we prepare for the various July 4th celebrations, **explosive and aerial fireworks are illegal** in Minnesota. Minnesota Statute 624.21 makes it illegal to possess or explode illegal fireworks. Fines can cost up to \$1000. Every year the Lake Shore PD receives and responds to illegal fireworks complaints. We ask that you **respect your neighbors** and abide by these laws and stay safe.

TZD (Toward Zero Deaths)

The Lake Shore PD is partnering with the Office of Traffic Safety and the Cass County Sheriff's Office in providing additional patrols enforcing seat belt use, watching for distracted drivers, speeders and arresting DWI offenders on selected roadways throughout Cass County. The city receives full reimbursement for the costs of providing the additional enforcement. TZD is driving Minnesota *Toward Zero Deaths* on our roads by reducing serious injuries and deaths through enforcement, education, engineering and emergency medical & trauma services.

DNR Public Access Agreement

For the second year, the Lake Shore PD is partnering with the Gull Chain of Lakes Association (GCOLA) to provide an officer to be stationed at the DNR public access on selected dates and times throughout the summer months. The officer will be educating and enforcing laws regarding the illegal transfer of aquatic plants and evasive species. GCOLA is covering the costs of the officer.

Telemarketing & Internet Scams

The Lake Shore PD has taken reports from our residents of phone scams and internet scams. When you send money to people you do not know personally or give personal or financial information to unknown callers, you increase your chances of becoming a victim of telemarketing fraud or identity theft. If you receive an email from a friend or relative asking you to wire them money, this is almost **always** a scam. Once money is wired there's no getting it back.

BOAT AND WATER SAFETY CLASSES OFFERED

The Gull Chain of Lakes Association (GCOLA) in conjunction with Cass and Crow Wing County Water Patrols, DNR Enforcement and US Army Corps of Engineer is again sponsoring two boat and water safety classes for all youths ages 12 to 17. According to Minnesota state law, all teens 13-17 years old are required to have a permit to operate a personal watercraft and all youth ages 12-17 must have a permit to operate a boat with a motor of over 25 HP. This class not only goes through all rules and regulations, but also provides all participants some hands on boat operation training as well. This class qualifies participants for the required permits. GCOLA will be giving participants a life jacket. The sheriff's office strongly recommends that all young people in this age bracket take the class.

There will be two opportunities to take this class; Tuesday, June 10 and Thursday, June 19 at Zorbaz Restaurant on County Road 77 in Lake Shore. Class starts at 8:30 a.m. Zorbaz will provide lunch for participants at no cost. All who are interested should call Mary Kay Larson at the Corps of Engineers for details and pre-registration. What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

Chemical products that have signal words on the labels such as Caution, Warning, Danger, Poison, Flammable, Combustible, and Corrosive.

These products include automotive, lawn and garden, home improvement and household cleaners. Examples include old gas, engine degreasers, old paint and paint products, pesticides, pool chemicals, stains, varnish, tar, oven cleaners, aerosol products, mothballs, glues, and drain cleaners.

Used motor oil and oil filters do not need to go through this program. Bring these items to any of the Cass County solid waste transfer sites at any time. Some area service stations and hardware stores also accept waste oil. Check with stores in your area for details.

Also accepting: Old electronics, TVs, computers (No business waste)

Fluorescent bulbs (homeowners and business OK)

Do NOT bring: Unusable joint compound – please dry out and dispose of in regular garbage.

Do NOT bring: Explosives or radioactive wastes.

Will it cost me money to drop off household hazardous materials?

No. Cass County residents can use this service at no additional cost.



Recycling Collection Service

Recycling Bins are located at the Lake Shore City Hall. The container has five (5) individual bins for separating cans, cardboard, glass, newsprint and plastic.

Please do *not* use the recycling area for depositing waste tires and white goods or garbage. This is a service to the community, so please do not abuse it or we may lose it.
DO NOT LEAVE ITEMS WHEN BINS ARE FULL.

- ◇ Wetlands
- ◇ Rentals
